What are Community Interest Companies?

- Limited liability companies for social enterprises
- "Social enterprises" deliver social and environmental change.
- Set up under company law in Great Britain.
- Created by the Companies (Audit, Investigations and Community Enterprise) Act 2004 and the Community Interest Company Regulations 2005

Why introduce Community Interest Companies?

- Gap identified in the range of options available
- A strong new brand
- Governance understood by funders and lenders
- Light touch regulation
- Demand led by the social enterprise community
- Office opened 25 July 2005 & over 450 incorporated

Additional Requirements for a Community Interest Company

- The Community Interest Test
- The Asset Lock
- The Community Interest Company Report

Eligibility to form a Community Interest Company

- Politically motivated organisations
- Unduly restrictive communities
- Charities
- Charities can form a CIC trading subsidiary
- Activities must be lawful

- Familiar and flexible legal structure of a company
- The branding and asset lock
- Transparency and light touch regulation
- No tax advantages
