## 1 Terminal Facilities List

## One terminal - different UNLOCODE's

Reason: multiple UNLOCODE's for the same port
$\rightarrow$ metropolitan code, municipal code
In the SMDG Master Terminal facilities list there are currently 2 columns for UNLOCODE's: a leading one and an alternative one. This gives a certain flexibility to the users to adjust to the codes required in different areas, consortia, trades or services.

## Special case China

Change of Chinese UNLOCODE's:

- Split up the codes for a metropolitan area (e.g. Shanghai) $\rightarrow 3$ codes
- airport, port and one code covering all functions for the metropolitan region
- "Old" UNLOCODE's are now assigned to the airports
- For shipping: two codes remain (metropolitan + port)

Today: majority of the shipping industry still uses the old codes, which means the airport codes
Some investigation results:

- Shipping lines: Preference is on metropolitan code (CNSGH, CNNBO, ...) Currently old codes are still in use
- Booking portals: new and old coldes
- Forwarders: new and old coldes
- IMO: codes with function "port" (CNSHG, CNNBG)
- Portbase codes with function "port" (CNSHG, CNNBG) (port community system,Netherlands)
- DAKOSY new codes (CNSGH/CNSHG) (port communication system, Hamburg)
- Chinese ports: seem to use the old codes

Task: to find a rule for the leading code (first column) and the alternative code (second column) including consideration of the special case "China".
11 April 2018:
Decision to be made between metropolitain and municipal codes
Proposal:

- first column: metropolitain code
- second column: municipal code
